Curriculum Development	Curricula are generally framed, amended and upgraded in accordance with the objectives of the University. National interests are given due attention but due care is taken to maintain and preserve the academic aspects. The process of preparation of the Curricula starts from the Board of Studies of each department where various academic aspects are assessed and revised by experts. Thus proposals are placed before the Academic Council for assessment and approval.
Teaching and Learning	The teaching- learning process adopted by the University sincerely provides for adequate opportunities for student's community. The process starts with admission itself. The University has been conducting entrance tests for the last several years for admission to different courses, academic as well as vocational. In vocational courses, sessional tests, projects - work, seminars etc. are the methods employed to maintain the academic standard.
Examination and Evaluation	The examinations are conducted on an annual basis. The University has been revising the methods of evaluation a number of times in accordance with the governmental guidelines. The University follows the system of single valuation. Papers are moderated as a matter of policy. The ratio of internal and external examiners is maintained in due course. The door delivery method helps in speedy valuation of answer books. At present we have the system of centralized evaluation.
Research and Development	Research has been a major area of academic activity in Sampurnanand Sanskrit University from the very beginning. A research and publication centre is set up in the University. It collects, preserves, edits and publishes manuscripts and papers

	presented in seminars. This wing of the University has been pursuing its set objectives with missionary zeal and dedication. The research staff consists of one Publication officer disignated as Director: Publication and four assistants.
